Of these, 4 were housebreaking, but most of the others were of a variety including underage drinking, fire raising, motor vehicle theft, and vandalism.

As a result of community council concerns raised at the last meeting, under age drinkers had been targeted in upper Dalmuir, with names being taken and alcohol confiscated.

Anne Hickey asked if some attention could be given to the Windsor Cres. Area as youths had been throwing snowballs at windows and creating nuisance in the area.

Planning Matters: G Howatson had only minor matters to report, but expressed concerns with the unfinished surrounds of a newly built house at 15B Glenhead Road.

Provost Agnew explained to the meeting that important changes were being made to the handling of planning applications, and the way some of them would be decided by officers using delegated powers.

WDC Report: gave an assurance that the Parkhall library would not be closing, and this had been officer suggestions pre-budget.

He had again been active in having graffiti removed within the area.

He expressed his concern about the lack of cctv camera coverage in the Radnor Street area due to the new camera siting not being finalised.

Provost Agnew reported he had recently attended a housing stock condition tour.

The arrangements to updated the memorial at Dalnottar Cemetery have been finalised and a dedication service is taking place there on 12th March.

Community Wardens: John Duffy, manager of the community wardens service, outlined the work of the wardens and how they could be of assistance in dealing with vandalism, noise and other matters.

Citizens Panel: N Etherington outlined the findings of a survey which claimed many people did not know of their community council operations. Although he did stress that this Comm. Council was higher rated than many others, he did think we should raise our profile, with more information published about our meetings. Some discussion followed and Neil's opinion was noted.

Community Participation Committee: G Howatson explained that as he is a substitute member of this committee he received the committee minutes and noted that N Etherington seemed to have been asking questions as representing Parkhall, North Kilbowie and Central Community Council, one question in particular being of concern as it referred to a WDC Councillor. N Etherington in explanation said that the minute taker had assumed he was representing the community council and that this was not so. W.
